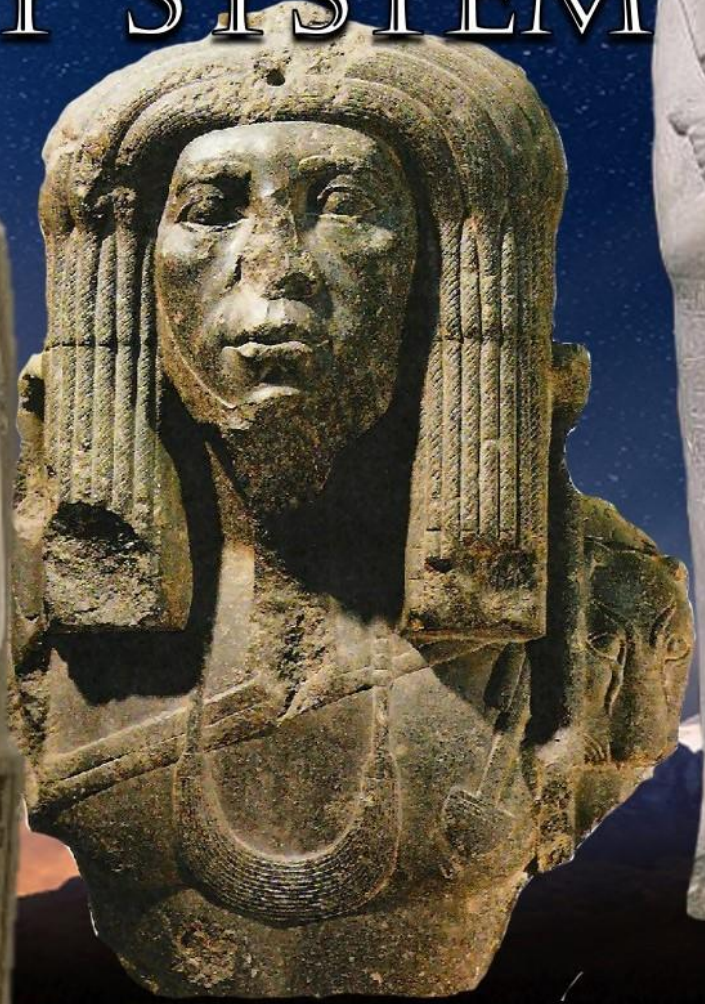

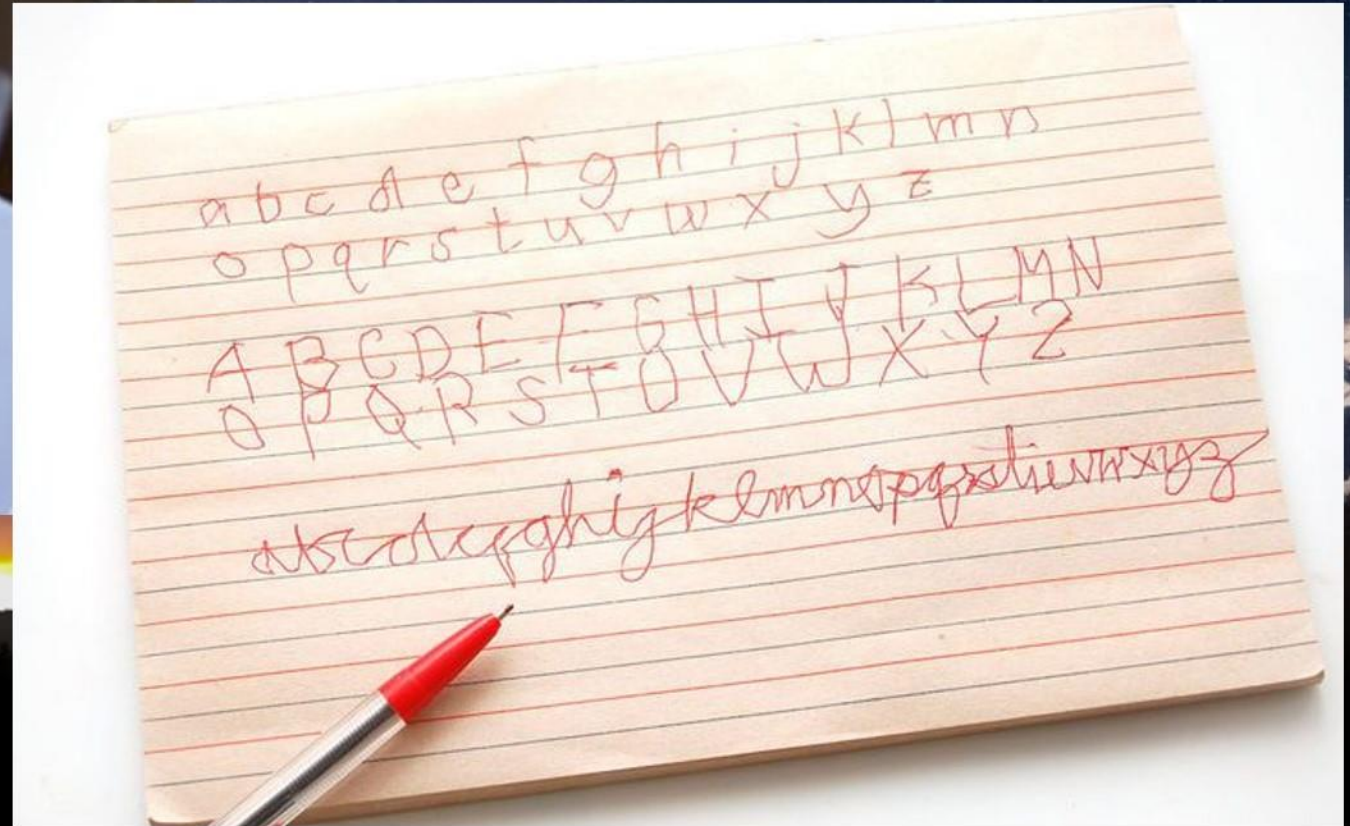

Einstein's Genius Linked to Well-Connected Brain Hemispheres

The debate over right brain-left brain lateralization has raged on for decades. A [study](#) released on October 4, 2013 found Albert Einstein's brilliance may be linked to the fact that his brain hemispheres were extremely well-connected. The ability to use right brain [creativity](#) and left brain logic simultaneously may have been what made Einstein a genius.

The part of the brain that connects the two hemispheres of the brain is called the corpus callosum. It contains a bundle of neuronal fibers found in humans and other higher order mammals that allow the two hemispheres to talk to one another.

The new study, "The Corpus Callosum of Albert Einstein's Brain: Another Clue to His High Intelligence," was published in the journal *Brain*. The research was led by Dean Falk who is an evolutionary anthropologist at Florida State University. Falk and her colleagues found that Albert Einstein had more extensive connections between certain parts of his

- Approx. 10% of the earth's people are left-handed
- Jesus sits on the right hand of god; left hand is usually considered side of judgement (Archangel Gabriel is sometimes cited for destruction of Sodom and Gemorrah)
- Satanism and "Black magic" sometimes called the "left-handed path"
- In Latin term for left side is "sinister"
- Parents in West used to strike baby's left hand if they first reached out with it
- Forced conversation is connected to speech impediments, dyslexia, and stuttering
- Many tools are made specifically for the right handed left of baby
- Ironically 3 of 5 children with IQ of 130 are left handed!

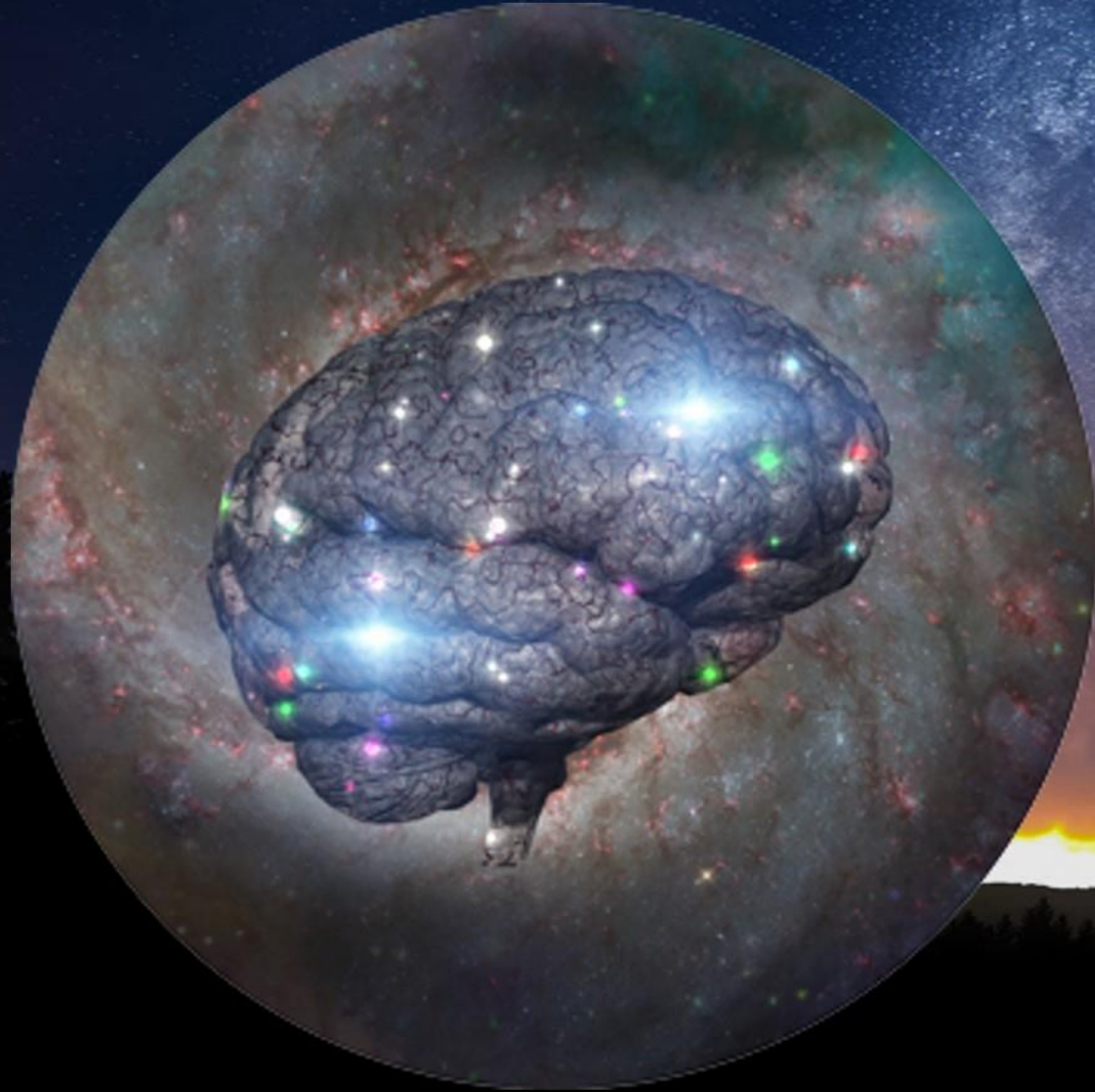

WikiHow's Keys to Learning to Write with Your Opposite Hand

- Practice writing with non-dominant hand for at least 30 days
 - Writing our lower and upper case alphabet can be helpful
- Strengthen your non-dominant hand
- Try to throw a small ball higher and higher
- Watch yourself writing with your dominant hand in a mirror to pick up fine movements
- Speak to people who use the hand that you do not use dominantly about tricks and tips
- Try to regularly do basic tasks with your non-dominant hand (brushing teeth, eating, putting on clothes, etc.)

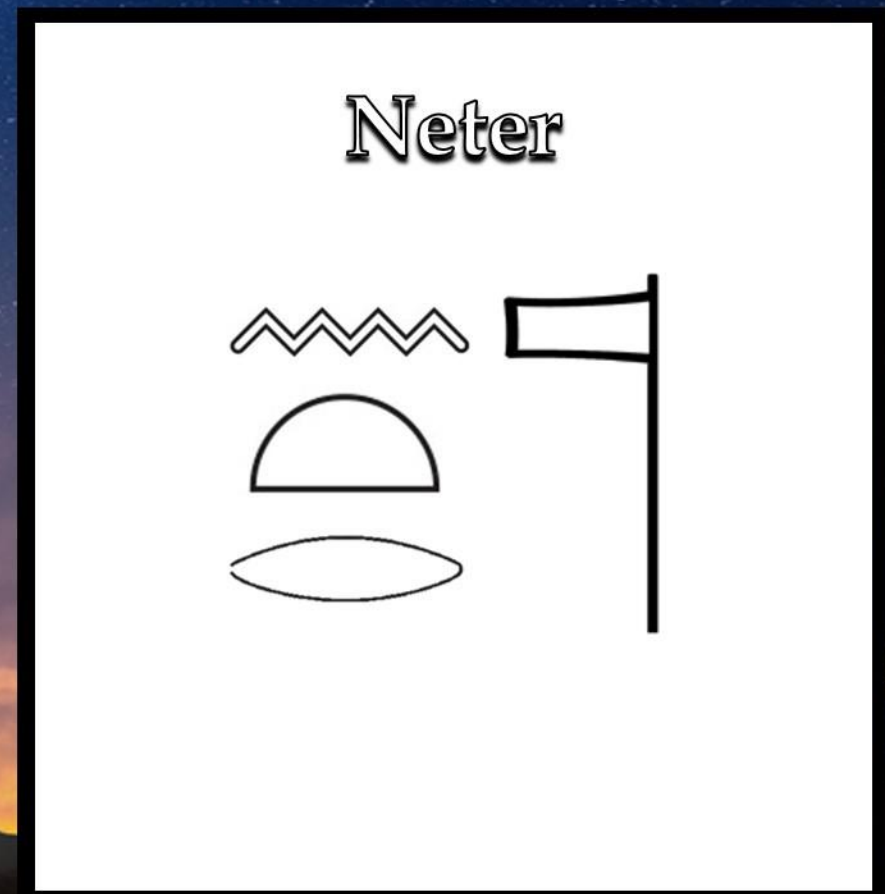
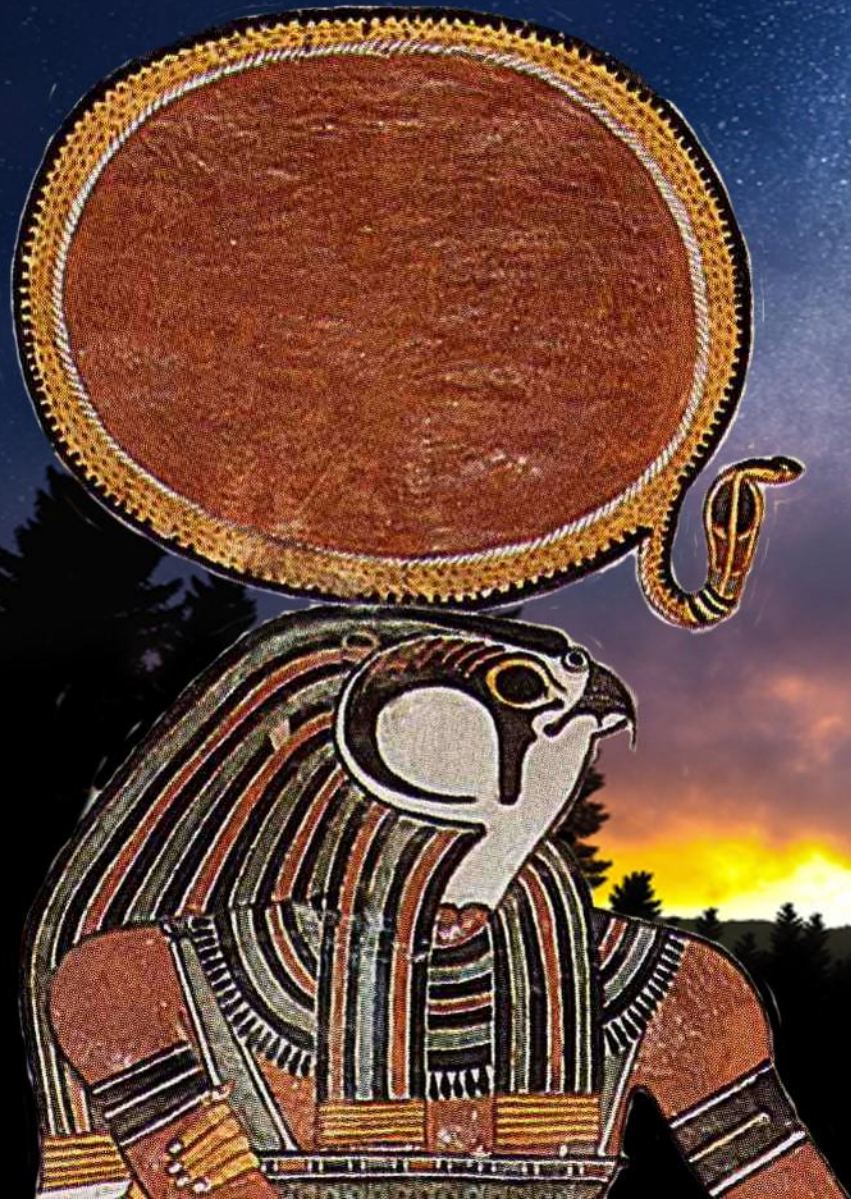
